

SPARX READER

Igniting a passion for reading among our students

The Hart School's use of the Sparx Reader programme for Key Stage 3 English homework has proven to be a resounding success this academic year, igniting a passion for reading among our students and helping teachers and families to track students' reading more easily.

With an expectation that students spend around 30 minutes per week engaged in the Sparx Reader platform and achieve 300 Sparx Reader Points (SRP), students in Years 7, 8, and 9 have collectively dedicated over

5,500 hours to reading, reading more than 1000 books so far this year. This is an incredible achievement and we are so proud of our wonderful KS3 students!

The impact of this initiative extends far beyond mere numbers. Through Sparx Reader, we have fostered a culture of regular independent reading, making the act of reading visible to both students and parents alike. Real-time tracking allows teachers to monitor each student's progress, enabling them to hold them

accountable and have meaningful conversations about their reading choices and comprehension.

Moreover, Sparx Reader's personalised approach ensures that every student finds reading both accessible and engaging. Tailored book recommendations, personalised homework tasks, and interactive quizzes keep students actively involved in their reading journey. The platform's accessibility features further ensure that all students can fully participate and enjoy

YOUNG CARER

Is your child a young carer?

A young carer is someone aged 25 and under who cares for a friend or family member who, due to illness, disability, a mental health problem or an addiction, cannot cope without their support. Older young carers are also known as young adult carers and they may have different support needs to younger carers.

A young carer may look after a parent or care for a brother or sister. They may do extra jobs in and around the home, such as cooking, cleaning or helping someone get dressed and move around.

A young carer may also give a lot of physical help to a

parent, brother or sister who's disabled or ill. Along with doing things to help siblings, they may be giving emotional support to family as well.

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM WEEK
